



#### **Infant Updates**

#### Look what we learned!

Language: Children and teachers listened to natural sounds on the Alexa and discussed what they were hearing. This advanced our language skills and enhanced our vocabulary.

Mathematics: Children explored nesting cups by putting things in the different size cups to explore measurement.

Science: Children explored a sensory bin of leaves and bugs and discussed what they were feeling in the bin to begin observing and classifying object.

Social Studies: We worked on our object permanence by finding toys under blankets and putting them away in the classroom.

#### Continue the learning at home!

Observing and classifying is a kindergarten readiness tool that each child needs to start developing from the beginning. You can help your infant start to build these skills with a few simple activities at home!

- Encourage your child to explore different objects using different senses.
- Give your child different textured materials to feel-such as a sponge, a soft cloth, and something rough.
- Encourage your older infant to name simple objects like spoons, food, milk, or anything else in their environment.

#### **Toddler Updates**

#### Look what we learned!

Language: We read the book <u>We are Going on a Bear Hunt</u> with our friends then looked around the room for pictures of bears. This helped us retell the story and build our listening and language skills.

Mathematics: Children explored measurement by playing with nesting cups in the sensory bin. We stacked, built, filled and dumped the cups while working on using measuring terms.

Science: Children and teachers played with toy dishes and sorted them while naming the dishes. Sorting objects is important for early development of science skills.


Social Studies: We begin to explore the world around us by mixing up a bin or toys and racing to put them away in the correct spot in the classroom. This builds early understanding of geography.

# Reminders for our Toddler parents...

\*Please make sure your child has a coat, hat and gloves at school. We go outside daily if weather permits.







#### Continue the learning at home!

Early science skills often come through observing and classifying different items. Below are a few tips you can use with your toddler to help them advance this area of their learning.

- Encourage your child to name everyday objects. If they want it, try to get them to repeat back the name of the object before you give it to them.
- Have your child expand on the name of the object-so instead of saying bear, say big bear.
- Play games with your child where they match similar items. So you could get a variety of blocks and balls and have children put them into two piles. One for blocks and one for balls.

#### **Preschool Updates**

#### Look what we learned!

Language: While reading <u>Mixed: A Colorful Story</u> we discussed color words, the beginning, middle and end of the story as well as what the characters did in the story.

Mathematics: The children sorted colored blocks of various sizes. we practiced using measurement terms while playing to learn about words like, biggest and smallest.

Science: With a blindfold on students reached into a bin of fall themed items and used their words to describe what they were feeling. We used items like pumpkins, fake spiders, slime and leaves. This helped us build our observational skills.

Social Studies: Children followed a map of the school to find different things around the school like the turtles, kitchen, baby rooms and Mrs. Lauren's office to begin to learn about geography.

#### Continue the learning at home!

Once your child reaches the preschool aged it is important to start advancing their knowledge surrounding science. Try these activities at home to engage your child in observing and classifying objects.

- Have your child separate items based on size, material, or color.
- Have your child play memory games where they match different pictures.
- Ask your child to tell you about objects. How big are they? What do they feel like? What color are they?

#### **Pre-k Updates**

#### Look what we learned!

Language: We started to learn about the parts of words and syllables while clapping to words such as chimpanzee, lion, elephant, etc. Teachers then read the story "Giraffes Can't Dance" and highlight the major events of the story.

Mathematics: Children sorted blocks by various sizes and used measurement terms to discuss each child's sorted piles of blocks.

Science: We talked about leaves changing colors and sorted leaves into piles by color to begin to explore our natural and physical world while building observational and categorizing skills.

Social Studies: Children followed a map of the school to find different things around the school like the turtles, kitchen, baby rooms and Mrs. Laurens office to begin to learn about geography.

\*Please make sure your child has a coat, hat and gloves at school. We go outside daily if the weather permits.

#### **Continue the learning at home!**

As your child prepares for kindergarten you want them to understand how to describe objects, their attributes and how to group them. Try these activities to engage your child in building these skills.

- Encourage your child to divide materials (such as blocks) into two groups. Once they do it, ask them why they picked those two groups. Them have them regroup the materials using a different characteristic (so big blocks and little blocks, then group by color)
- Give your child a natural object to explore. Have them explain what they see in depth. How does it look? How does it feel? etc.

### **School Aged Updates**

#### **Fun at WOW!**

We have really been enjoying building and doing obstacle courses in the classroom with our new large blocks, stepping stones and rings. We have even been adding tents, building blocks and any thing else we can find to make our courses more difficult and fun for our friends.
